Project

There are five parts to the project:

- Notes & Lesson
- Assignment with Answer Sheet
- Quiz for the class with Answer Sheet
- Poster
- Test Questions

All sections need to be typed up and emailed to the teacher as an electronic copy. Especially those that need an answer key. (acamr.micheals@gmail.com or Michael.stanger@aca.edu.kw).

Notes & Lessons

- Presentation and notes given to the class.
- Contains all the needed vocabulary from the sections
- Has examples to go with each vocabulary word and can explain them to the class when presenting.
- Has images to go with his notes.
- Presents to class in any matter they wish.
- Takes 20-30 minutes to go through notes with the class and describes sections as they go through.
- Has extra interesting facts to go with the presentation
- Electronic copy of presentation sent to the teacher.

Assignment

- Minimum of 10 mark assignment.
- Should be able to answer and do the assignment based on the lesson/notes that were given out that day. If needed they can use the textbook as well.
- An electronic copy needs to be sent to the teacher. If you want the teacher to make a copy of it to give to the class he needs it the day before it is due.
- Students are responsible for marking the assignment they have created. If you need help you should talk to each other in the group. Also know that Mr. Micheal will give you a hand if you need to figure out how you are going to mark the assignment! Once you have marked it see Mr. Micheal so that you can record the marks on paper.
- Answer key should also be electronic and submitted to Mr. Micheal before the assignment is handed out.
